PROGRAMME NOTE

This work was commissioned by Stephen Cleobury and King's College Choir. It is the first of six new pieces commissioned through a generous benefaction of the late Michael Boswell (KC 1959), choral scholar.

Psalm 46 has always appealed to me, with its sense of peace, trust and acceptance. I like the idea that the 'destructions' wrought by God are of the weapons and trappings of war.

I have used ideas of tempest and resolution, with verse 10 standing alone as a moment of serenity.

Be Still was first performed on March 4th 2015 at King's College Chapel, directed by Stephen Cleobury, with organ scholar Richard Gowers.
