Scoreboards


You want to get to the top of the league by the end of the book!


Fill in the scoreboards for every Manager's masterclass match.


Add up all your points at the end of the book.




Team talk: upbeats!

Notes that come before the first main bar are called 'upbeats'. Notice that the value of the upbeat is taken away from the last bar. Remember to count yourself in before you start playing.









Hat-trick – 3 notes at once!
