1 Tuning track



Ukulele is a Hawaiian name meaning **uku** (gift or reward) and **lele** (to come). Ukuleles came to Hawaii on a ship from Madeira. See if you can find Hawaii and Madeira on a map or globe.



Hello, I'm a ukulele! I'm your new friend from Hawaii. Ask your teacher or an adult to tune me!

I have a **sound hole** on my **body**. This is how I make sounds – it's a bit like a mouth!



This is my **headstock**. My ears are **tuning pegs** that can be twisted to tighten or loosen my strings. Please don't touch my ears when I'm in tune!


I have a long **neck** with metal lines called **frets**.

How many **strings** have I got?

Playing position

Pick me up so that you are cradling me like a baby.

Can you hold me in place? Put your left hand on my headstock, keeping my body under your right arm.




Resting position

Sometimes I will want to rest from making any sound at all.

Lie me down with my strings on your knee.

For a long rest, put me to bed in my case.





stage 5 Am chord

This is the chord of A minor, written as 'Am'. To play this chord, place your 2nd finger on fret 2 of the G string. Sometimes people say that major chords sound happy and minor chords sad. Play the C chord and then the Am chord. What do you think?

Drunken Sailor!

Dead String alert!

Remember *The Strings Song*? When you play strings separately, it is called **plucking**. Let's play *Drunken Sailor!*, strumming the Am chord on $\frac{1}{4}$ notes and then plucking the G string on $\frac{1}{8}$ notes.

hot tip

Use the correct finger – you will need the other fingers to do other things later!
