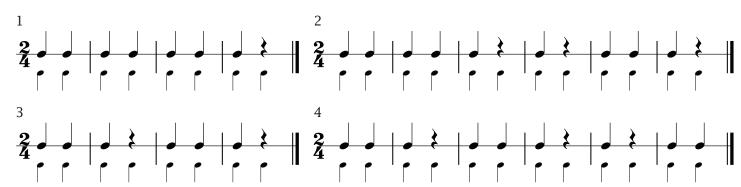

Rhythmic exercises

- You tap the lower line and sing the upper line.

Before you begin each exercise count two bars in – one out loud and one silently.

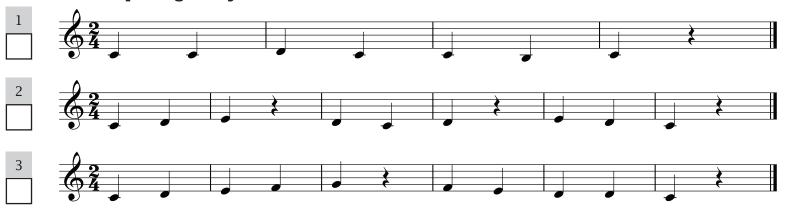

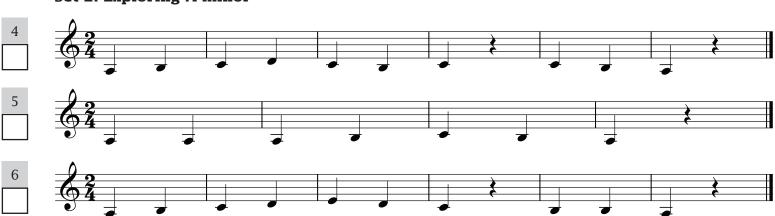
Hear each exercise in your head before you play it.
