



## TRIADS

When you play two or more notes at the same time, it is called a **chord**.


A **triad** is a special kind of chord made up of three notes.



Circle the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> notes of these steps from C.











Now stack the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> notes to make a triad.

C major triads






Now try to play these C major triads on the piano.
