




Tuning

The standard Ukulele string tuning is G–C–E–A, shown here on the treble staff and piano keyboard. Note that the G string is tuned higher than the C string.

You can tune your Ukulele using a piano or keyboard (or any other instrument that you know is in tune!) or by using an electronic chromatic tuner.

If just one string on your Ukulele is in tune then you can use it to tune the other strings as well.

This diagram shows which fretted notes match the note of the open string above. Eg. Pluck the first string at the 5th fret and match the note to the second open string, and so on.
