This work, originally commissioned by the LSO in 1972 with funds provided by the Arts Council of Great Britain, was completed in 1987 in response to a commission from the BBC for performance at the 1987 Henry Wood Promenade Concerts.

The first performance (incomplete) was given by the BBC Symphony Orchestra conducted by Mark Elder at the Royal Albert Hall, London on 10 August 1987. The first complete performance was given by the BBC Symphony Orchestra conducted by Richard Bernas at the Royal Festival Hall, London on 8 April 1989 as part of the Nicholas Maw Day at the South Bank Centre.

Odyssey is recorded by the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra conducted by Simon Rattle on EMI CDS 7542772.

A Note on the Trumpet parts

The trumpet parts in this work are notated in C for trumpets 1 and 2, and in C and D for trumpets 3 and 4. In certain passages the parts are exceptionally taxing for the instruments as designated and it might prove more practical to employ the following suggested alternatives.

Bars 693-705 Tpts. 1 & 2 in C	Alternatively use trumpets in D.
Bars 982-998	Alternatively was transported in D. or piecelo.
Tpts. 1 & 2 in C	Alternatively use trumpets in D, or piccolo trumpets in F.
Tpts. 3 & 4 in D	Alternatively use piccolo trumpets in F.
Bars 1393-1409	
Tpts. 1 & 2 in C	Alternatively use trumpets in D and/or (from bar 1401) piccolo trumpets in F.
Tpts. 3 & 4 in D	Alternatively use piccolo trumpets in F.
Bars 1556-1604	
Tpts. 3 & 4 in D	In the passage between bars 1556-1567 piccolo trumpets will very probably be necessary. As it stands, bars 1568-1604 were notated for D trumpets owing to the difficulty of changing instruments in bar 1568. However, if piccolo trumpets are used in the previous passage (1556-1567), and they are played by different players, then bars 1568-1604 will undoubtedly be facilitated by

If piccolo trumpet players are used, specialist players will probably be needed.
