
There are **crotchet** beats in a bar.


Keep counting as you clap or tap.

Place the finger you will need on the first note in bar 1 (right hand) and on the first note in bar 5 (left hand). Play through the piece steadily without stopping.

Do you notice how the dynamics (f, pp) change?


! Watch out for the interval of a third in bar 7.

Lift your hand neatly at the end of each slur.



Play rhythmically and firmly.




